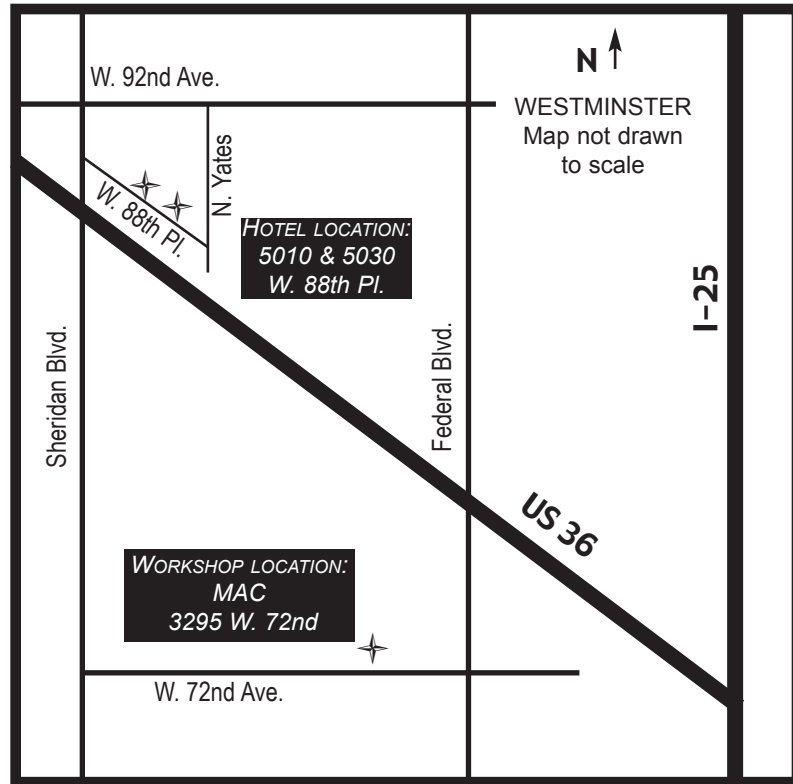


DIRECTIONS...

...to Workshop location:
 From Denver/I-25: Take US 36 to Federal Blvd; go South on Federal to W. 72nd Avenue; go West on W. 72nd approximately one block to the site.

...to Hotels:
 From Northbound US 36, exit Right onto Sheridan Blvd. then make another Right onto W. 88th Place.

From Southbound US 36, it is easy to miss the turn onto W. 88th Place. If you do, go North on Sheridan Blvd., East on W. 92nd Avenue, South on N. Yates, and West onto W. 88th Place.

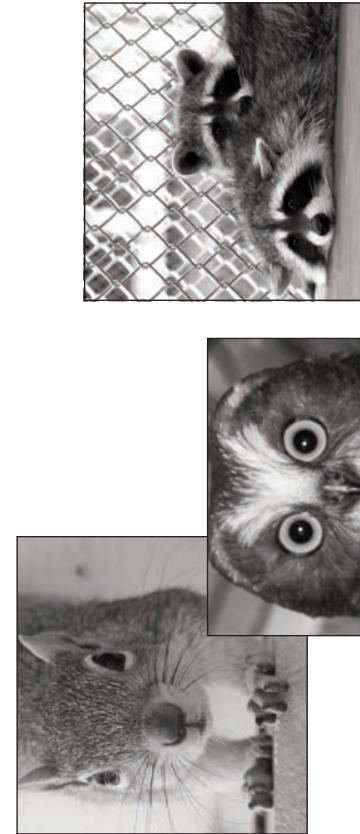

Meeting at the MAC in Westminster, CO, we will have the opportunity to hear presentations from wildlife rehabilitation organizations across the gamut of the "rehab" community.

Kicking off the weekend of informative presentations, breakout sessions, group discussions and plenty of food and door prizes is keynote speaker Pat Craig, Founder and Executive Director of The Wild Animal



Sanctuary. He will share the rewards and challenges of large wild animal rehabilitation and the role his organization plays in the wildlife rehabilitation community.

Wherever your passion and desire to help in the world of wildlife rehabilitation lie—vet-tech student, volunteer, supporter, rehabilitator, veterinarian, or a person with a new found interest—give yourself a real

LOCATION

The Symposium will take place at the MAC in Westminster, the site of the past three years' CCWR events. Located just south of US 36 on West 72nd Avenue, it is a short drive from many lodging options and restaurants (see map).



CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) CREDITS

We've applied to The Colorado Association for Certified Veterinary Technicians for CE credits for Colorado CVTs, and that request has been approved on an hour-for-lecture-hour basis. A "Certificate of Attendance" for the symposium will be provided at the end of the meeting to those requesting this documentation for their personal records.

LODGING

ADVANTAGES AND CHALLENGES OF WORKING WITH LARGE WILD ANIMALS.

Presented by Patrick Craig, Founder and Executive Director of The Wild Animal Sanctuary in Keenesburg, Colorado.

She is a PhD candidate in Clinical Sciences in Epidemiology and has completed a two-year fellowship at CSU in exotics.

THE FIRST 24 HOURS/ PASSERINES. Presented by Nancy Kelly, Executive Director of Second Chance Wildlife Rehab in Pueblo. She has been a licensed rehabilitator for 19 years, specializing in all non-raptor bird species.

THE FIRST 24 HOURS/ MAMMALS. Presented by Dr. Alison Hazel, DVM. Dr. Hazel has been involved in wildlife rehabilitation for 20 years and currently serves on the BOD of Greenwood Wildlife Rehabilitation Center. She was voted 1998 Wildlife Veterinarian of the Year for New York State.

BAT AWARENESS & CONSERVATION IN COLORADO. Presented by Cindy Mosch, Manager of Rocky Mountain Cave Resources, LLC. She has been caring for injured bats and educating cavers about bats for nearly 20 years.
